CONFIRMATION CELEBRATION

Pentecost Sunday marks the birth of the church: the moment after Jesus Christ's resurrection and ascension when his promise of the Holy Spirit was fulfilled! A miraculous event happened that day for the first Christians, when the Spirit seemed to blow around them like wind, descend upon them like fire, and fill them with the ability to proclaim the good news of the Gospel for all peoples. Many churches celebrate confirmation each year on Pentecost, linking the blessing of our youth with the ancient arrival of the Holy Spirit. This day marks the entry of our confirmands into the full responsibility and authority of membership in our congregation as they affirm promises made on their behalf when they were baptized as infants or children.

ENDOWMENT FUND

The Endowment committee gave \$2,000 to Orion Communities for their general operating fund in February. The next meeting is May 22nd. STEWARDSHIP REPORT

The first quarter of 2013 has been a challenging period for our finances. We have seen a decline in giving through weekly envelopes at \$33,981 compared to \$37,650 for last year. This represents a 14% short fall to the amount budgeted for the first quarter. While actual spending continues to be less than the amount in the budget, this difference has declined by nearly \$6,000.

The new budget policy that was adopted in November 2011 created a single unified budget for apportioning giving received from the plate and envelopes. We are obligated to meet the operational needs of the church first before any funds are given to our undesignated benevolent missions. The reduced level of giving may impact the amount available to support these chosen missions.

The life and spirit of the church is ongoing every day. Our support should come from a feeling of gratitude for all that the church provides to us. Our generosity should reflect the never ending love and care that is provided to us by God.

MORINGA COMMUNITY DAFFODIL SUNDAY

St. James is proud to continually support the Moringa Community! Moringa Community aims to help the citizens of Ghana create a self sustaining community through teaching food preservation, nutrition, and crafts that can then be sold.

Because 2013 is the last year for the Daffodil Days program of the ACS, we celebrated in a special way at St. James by planting 19 donated potted daffodils in our Prayer Garden, where they will continue to bloom for many years to come in tribute to those we have lost to cancer, and in honor of the cancer survivors in our congregation and community.

Susan Shafer, Income Development Representative for the American Cancer Society, was our guest speaker. Susan offered reflections on Daffodil Days during the time that the American Cancer Society supported this worthwhile program.

The Lighting of the Memorial Candle, Blessing of the Flowers, a picturesque slide show of Daffodil Sundays at St. James through the years, and a time for sharing our fondest Daffodil Days Memories were also highlighted.

As in prior years, the re-dedication of 34 St. James cancer survivors was observed. THANK YOU to everyone who have supported Daffodil Days through the years. St. James has raised approximately \$16,635.00 over the past 19 years for the ACS' Daffodil Days. It is a legacy that St. James should be very proud of.
