COVENANT MINISTER CALL PROCESS

On June 11, the Consistory of St. James voted unanimously to begin the process of calling a "Covenant Minister" for the next phase of our congregation's life. 10 members were present to vote, while 2 others who couldn't attend had already expressed their support for this decision.

At the time of a pastor's resignation, it is more common to call an Interim Minster; the interim would then immediately begin guiding the congregation through a search for a settled pastor. An Interim Minister typically serves for 12-18 months (in healthy congregations with full-time ministry openings); and Interim Ministers expressly agree that they will not consider a settled call to the church they are serving. For the ten weeks of our summer worship schedule (June 30 - Sept. 1), we will continue to offer nursery care and children's church for any children in elementary school or younger. ENDOWMENT UPDATE

This May, the Endowment Committee awarded \$1000 to the Oklahoma Disaster Relief through Church World Service. New applications for grants are encouraged and should be submitted prior to the next meeting on Wed. August 28th. Application forms can be found on the bulletin board in the narthex or by contacting Nancy Ewing (chairperson).

The St. James UCC Endowment Fund was set up in 1998 with funds received from the estate of Matilda Kutra. The money is invested in various Vanguard accounts to preserve and grow the investment and to produce income to distribute to designated charities. The original investment was \$174,000 and the total had grown to \$240,500 at the end of 2011. Growth comes from reinvesting capital gains and from additional contributions.

The bylaws state that we are allowed to use only the income each year. Typically, we are able to disperse at least \$5000 per year (often much more, depending on the investment returns). Recipients must make applications to the committee and are approved as falling under one of the categories set up for the fund. The categories are: Christian Education, Community Service & Outreach, and the Wider Mission of St. James UCC. Please note that the money is not permitted to be used for the regular expenses of the church.

The endowment fund gives us the opportunity to participate in the community, expand our concept of stewardship, and help deserving groups with funds for their projects. Contributions to the Endowment fund are always welcome. You can be sure that money given to this fund will continue to bring dividends to charities now and in the future.

CONFERENCE STAFF RELOCATES

On Sunday, May 19, a Service of Word & Sacrament was held to mark the closing of the Church House of the Pennsylvania Southeast Conference of the United Church of Christ. This facility has hosted our PSEC staff and ministries (including our Christian Education Resource Center) for more than twenty-five years.

The decision to close represents an awareness of the changing use of resources in the Christian church today. The income from the properties will allow us to do more ministry in local churches and to launch some new initiatives. The Conference Ministry Team expects to be "on the road" more, visiting with churches and groups in their local settings. We also hope to direct more financial resources to church leadership training and support.

COVENANT MINISTER CALL PROCESS (Continued from front cover)

However, the consistory has decided that a slightly different option, a Covenant Minister, is in the better interest of the congregation. In this scenario, consistory will create a Covenant with a pastor, calling him or her to a longer term of service (about three years). This pastor will initially focus on completing the Revitalization program in which we are currently active (and just beginning to enter the phase of congregational participation). In 2014, as the Revitalization activities transition into a regular ministry of growth in our church, the Covenant Minister will then begin directing us through a pastoral search. One significant difference: unlike an Interim, a Covenant Minister is permitted to be considered as a candidate for a settled pastorate.

The next step is for Consistory to begin interviewing available candidates for this position, with the intention of selecting someone as soon as possible, but while also taking time to find someone who will fit our congregation well. If there is a gap between Pastor Rachael's final Sunday and the selection of a Covenant Minister, supply pastors can fill in (just like when a pastor is on vacation). The selection of the Covenant Minister, and the creation of the covenant, is up to the Consistory; but whenever a settled pastor is called, that decision will once again be by a vote of the congregation.

Our consistory members are prayerfully preparing to lead our congregation through this process with wisdom and care. Please keep them, and our congregation's future, in your prayers as well!

From the Pastor's Desk...

HARVEST TIME

On Sunday, July 7, we will celebrate our last worship service as pastor and congregation. The appointed reading in the lectionary cycle for that Sunday comes from the Gospel of Luke, chapter 10. It is a fitting message for this moment. Jesus commissions seventy-two disciples and sends them out to share the Gospel in new places. He warns them that it will be challenging, and he also reassures them: "the harvest is bigger than you can imagine, but there are few workers." After their journeys, the seventy-two return joyously, filled with hope at their success in sharing the Good News.

Entering into a time without a leader can be daunting, whether it is because the leader leaves (as in the Acts of the Apostles, chapter 1) or because the people are sent. I am certainly not claiming to be Jesus as I leave you! But it is helpful to remember that, as long as we remain dependent on any particular leader or teacher, we too easily become comfortable in our supporting roles. Times of transition shake us up, and challenge us to reconsider the ministry to which every one of us is called through our baptisms into discipleship. Jesus promised a harvest beyond our wildest dreams. Do we still have faith in that promise? We can see churches across the country declining and even closing, as if the harvest were dried up. But I believe the key is in the second part of what Jesus said: there are few workers. We've settled into expectations that the pastor and a small number of leaders will do the harvesting, while everyone else reaps the benefits. But this isn't what Jesus imagined. If we want to see our churches full of life again, it doesn't all depend on a pastor. Hear this time of transition as a call to you: the harvest is plentiful! Now is the time for the workers to answer the call.
