
ACTIVIES COMMITTEE

"After all my bills are paid, I want 10 persent of my estate (a tithe) to go to St. James United Church of Christ, 321 South Limerick Road, Limerick Pa"

With these words in our Last Will and Testament we can have a powerful, lasting impact on the ability of St. James U.C.C. to engage in God's Mission in the world.

Churches in the 21st century are going to face many challenges with the ability to survive financially being one of the major ones. Although estate gifts by themselves will not make a congregation thrive, they can help ensure that a congregation is able to survive, which is of course the first requirement of thriving. In fact, over the next two decades a gap will emerge between those congregations with faithful estate giving and those without this support. Those where people faithfully include the congregation when planning their estates will be strong enough to focus on mission rather than always worrying about just surviving. Those without this base of support are likely to be barely hanging on or be forced to close their doors.

We know we cannot take our money or material possessions with us when the Lord calls us to our eternal home, but we are responsible for the stewardship of these resources. This in NOT a suggestion that people leave ALL they have to the church. It is a request that each of us give due consideration to offering TITHE - 10% of our estates to the ongoing work of the church.

Americans are a very generous people giving some \$300 billion dollars each year to charities with the single largest share-one third-going to churches. However, only 8% of estate gifts are given to churches, mainly because very few churches ever ask people to consider giving these gifts. People with deep commitments to their local church have even left large bequests to colleges they never had any personal connection to. Why? Because the college asked for the estate gift and the local church did not.

Since one of my core responsibilities as an covenant pastor is to strengthen the ability of St. James U.C.C. to faithfully minister into the future God is calling you to , I am convinced that neglecting to make this request would essentially undercut any other work I do here with you. Therefore, being faithful to my call as a pastor, I ask you to consider including St. James U.C.C. in your estate giving. Putting the simple language in bold above (or language like it) into your Will is all it takes.

God, on this most challenging day, be with me. Open my eyes to see moments of pain and suffering around me

into which I may carry your loving presence. Amen.

Household Prayer: Evening

Holy One, into your hands I commit this day that I have lived. Salvage what needs saving in me. Strengthen what is good in me. And in all things bind me closer to you through Jesus Christ. Amen.

Easter Questions for Reflection

When Mary Magdalene first saw the resurrected Jesus, she did not recognize him, even though she knew the tomb was empty. Have you ever experienced the presence of the risen Christ, even when you were not expecting him? Are there times you have been in the presence of the risen Christ but have not recognized him? How would you know?

Household Prayer: Morning

Jesus, victorious Lord, I exult in your resurrection. As I sing "alleluia" with my voice, let my life embody "alleluia" as a testimony to your love and a witness to your eternal life. Amen.

Household Prayer: Evening

Lord, the days of sadness are over, for you have risen from the dead. As you conquered the grave, free your servant from fear of harm or death, that I may rest in peace this night and in the morning rise to sing "alleluia." Amen.

Week 3 Question for Reflection

According to the gospel, Christ's wounds were not erased by the resurrection. In fact, he invites Thomas and the other disciples to touch his wounds to bring the disciples back to faith. How might we in the church use our wounds to help others come to faith?

Household Prayer: Morning

Holy One, you have made known to me the ways of life and have promised to fill me with the gladness of your presence. Keep me mindful of your guidance and your promise as I travel through this day, that my heart may be glad. Amen.

Household Prayer: Evening

Thank you, God, for giving me your counsel today. Tonight, as I sleep, may the dreams of my heart also serve to instruct me in your ways. In you I have a good heritage, and my heart, my soul, and my body rest in you. Amen.
