

CONGREGATIONAL LIFE cont...

PSEC sold the Church House in Collegeville. The Budget and Finance committee of the Conference submitted the following disposition of the funds (\$879,109.62) from said sale as follows:

Debt Reduction: \$365,000 is being set aside for debt reduction. \$250,000 will be put toward reducing the debt on Mensch Mill and \$115,000 toward internal loans.

Operating Expenses Buffer: A small fund of \$50,000 will act as a buffer for fluctuating income from OCWM contributors.

Investing in the Future: Investing of these funds (\$214,109.62) in an unrestricted endowment fund, being able to draw only on a portion of the interest.

New Ministry: \$250,000 is being earmarked allowing us, imagine what is possible and embracing opportunities rather than operating in a mindset of scarcity.

Lehigh Valley Super Utilizer Partnership A St James Mission Partner

The Lehigh Valley Super Utilizer Partnership is a project in the Allentown area, based on a successful model developed by Dr. Jeff Brenner of the Camden Coalition for Health Care. Among its goals are to, "Improve quality of life and health of high utilizer patients" and to, "Reduce health cost..." Their patients are the "sickest of the sick" in the Lehigh Valley, people with broken lives who otherwise fall through the cracks of our society's support system.

In particular, our partnership focuses on supporting the work of Lisa Cordero, a Parish Nurse who leads the outreach team. Lisa has a passion for serving God, and feels called to serve the body, soul, and spiritual needs of these people. She tells us that,

"It is my experience as a faith based nurse to seek opportunity to show the love of Christ, and often times His love is best seen in meeting tangible needs in moments of crisis. It opens the door to show we truly care. It paves the way for the initial months and once they are out of crisis, they can begin to trust that the hands and feet of those serving them are actually the hands and feet of those who love Christ. It is amazingly beautiful!"

Through our partnership, we enable Lisa to meet temporary tangible needs of patients in crisis that might not otherwise be possible. We provide support in the form of: donations of requested new or gently used items, hands on help, and monetary contributions. Come and get to know Lisa better when she joins with us in worship on Sunday May 18th.

PASTOR'S NOTE

The Lehigh Valley Super Utilizer Partnership is one of five pilot programs nationwide. This is proving to be a successful model.

Recently a local UCC pastor shared a story about a congregant with an impacted tooth but who was unable to pay the \$200 for a dentist to remove the tooth. (The pastor did not know about this at time.) The congregant went to the ER three times and was sent home untreated each time. Then she developed a life threatening infection (from the tooth), went into a coma and spent ten days in ICU. The tooth was removed.

The Super Utilizer Partnership creates a network of emotional and spiritual support, including early intervention. Basically the partnership makes sure people like that congregant is able to have that tooth attended to before the suffering of a life threatening situation - and a medical bill in excess of \$100,000.

I know Lisa and look forward to seeing her again on May 18th.

Household Prayer: Evening

Faithful God, my rock and my fortress, into your hands I commit my spirit. As darkness falls, let your face shine upon your servant, and keep me in your steadfast love. Amen.

Week 4 Questions for Reflection

According to the psalmist, God brought the people through trials, tests, burdens, and pain to a spacious place of life, breath, and salvation. God heard their prayers and opened them to deliverance. Where have you felt such a spacious place? What story do you tell of the ways that God is blessing you? What story does your faith community tell of the ways in which God is blessing them?

Household Prayer: Morning

I give thanks for the gift of life and breath that is mine today in Christ. Make me eager to do good and to resist evil, and grant me the wisdom to recognize the difference.

Fill me with your assurance in all I say and do that I may share the hope that is within me in gentleness and reverence of Christ. Amen.

O God, in whom I live and move and have my being, you hear me when I cry and listen to my prayer; you set my feet on steady ground, you never leave me alone. As I rest in you tonight, sanctify my heart in Christ, and fill me with your strength, that I may rise to love and serve you and greet another day. Amen.
