<sup>30</sup>They went on from there and passed through Galilee. And he did not want anyone to know, <sup>31</sup>for he was teaching his disciples, saying to them, "The Son of Man is going to be delivered into the hands of men, and they will kill him. And when he is killed, after three days he will rise." <sup>32</sup>But they did not understand the saying, and were afraid to ask him. Mark 9: 30-32

Dear St. James family,

One of the things we will be talking about in September is asking questions. In the Bible verses above, the disciples have questions for Jesus about what he said about being killed and rising but are afraid to ask. I wonder why they are afraid? Are they afraid that Jesus will scold them – accuse them of having no faith or understanding? Possibly, but at the same time, what he said is very important, and it's very important to have some understanding around something like Jesus' death and resurrection. I would have a lot of questions. "Are you talking about yourself here as the Son of Man?" "If so, when are you going to be delivered, and what does that mean?" "What do you mean you're going to be killed?" "What do you mean by raised?" and probably most important, "What are we going to do when you're gone?"

But rather than ask questions, the disciples make an assumption that one of them is going to have to take over, which is why they start talking about who the greatest is. For some reason, they don't seem to be aware of what the resurrection means or that the Holy Spirit will be with them to continue on with the ministry. It can be misconstrued to think that the disciples are just bragging. "Peter's the greatest at fishing." "John is the greatest at carpentry." But what they are actually discussing is who they think will be the best one to take over the ministry when Jesus is gone. The disciples are already making plans for Jesus' departure. They don't want to tell him that. If they had just asked him what they wanted to know, rather than be embarrassed, they could have gotten Jesus' reassurance. Instead of acting like they will be on their own soon, they could have shared deeply with Jesus about their fears and questions, and Jesus could have explained in more detail.

Some people believe that the Bible is the inerrant word of God and is not to be questioned. I was having a conversation with an internet stranger about it, and they just couldn't wrap their brains around the idea that parts of the Bible are "wrong." They see the Bible as being "factual" as opposed to "truthful." It's hard for some to see that there are parts of the Bible that simply don't apply to us 21st century people. We don't concern ourselves with wearing clothing with only one kind of thread (Leviticus 19:19) for instance. But some in the Church still believe that women should not speak in church and should be submissive to their husbands (1 Corinthians 14: 33-35) just because the Bible says so. It is time to get away from that mindset and start asking questions. What bothers you about the Bible? What questions do you have? Don't be afraid. The truth will set you free (John 8:32.)

#### A Message from the Pastoral Relations Committee....

The Pastoral Relations Committee is an important standing committee at St. James UCC which, you may not hear about frequently. This committee, often addressed as the PRC, is charged with the task of supporting healthy relationships between our pastor and the congregation to enhance the effectiveness and ministry of St. James. The goal is to promote faithful, shared ministry between the pastor and the congregation.

The purpose of the PRC is twofold. First, the PRC works to support our pastor's leadership by interpreting roles, functions, boundaries and needs of the pastor to the congregation. Secondly, the Pastoral Relations Committee serves as an advisory group to the pastor, sharing ideas, expectations, and concerns of the congregation with the pastor. The main goal is to promote healthy communication within the whole congregation while working in a context of confidentiality, support, and honesty with the pastor.

Those serving on the Pastoral Relations Committee today are the same five members who served on the Search Committee, but the time has come to refresh and offer the opportunity to other members of the St. James UCC congregation. The PRC meets quarterly unless something comes up and needs to be addressed between regularly scheduled meetings.
