Dear St. James family,

One of the things we will be talking about in October is how we can be angel friends. What is an angel friend? The idea came to me from the movie, It's a Wonderful Life. George Bailey has an "angel friend" named Clarence who helped him to see that life is truly worth living, even though George was in terrible trouble. Clarence, in essence, told George, "Take heart. Get up; he is calling you." George self-identified as a man who doesn't pray, but by the end of the movie, he tearfully prays, "Please God, let me live again."

Our blind friend Bartimaeus had many angel friends helping him. It doesn't seem that way at first, as they shush him to be quiet. But when Jesus tells them to call him (notice he doesn't just go over to him himself) he is involving the others in the healing. They tell him, "Take heart. Get up; he is calling you." They have the chance to watch a miracle unfold right in front of them.

How do we do that? How do we tell someone "Take heart. Get up; he is calling you." How do we become an angel friend? When we follow in the Way, we will be living again, not just existing. When we pray and listen and act on what we hear, Jesus will lead the Way. When we invite someone to worship with us, we are telling them, "Take heart. Get up; he is calling you." When we pray with someone, we are telling them, "Take heart. Get up; he is calling you." When someone feels like they have nowhere to turn, like George Bailey, we can say, "Take heart. Get up; he is calling you." The good news is that Jesus, our best angel friend, is indeed calling us. When we take heart and get up and answer the call, we will throw our old life down as Bartimaeus threw down his cloak and pick up new life. What a relief it will be to take heart, get up and answer the call of Jesus, who loves us just as we are, AND who loves us too much to leave us that way. Jesus will give us mercy when we have a desperate desire to be free, which we can then share with others – we too can become angel friends. Come and see.

She has collaborated with numerous esteemed collectives and artists, including Orchestra 2001, Network for New Music in Philadelphia, Bachhanalia Baroque Ensemble, Melodia Women's choir in New York City, Bolshoi Theater Woodwind Quintet, Philharmonic Symphony orchestra in Belarus, as well as internationally celebrated musicians, opera diva Oksana Volkova, Belgian flutist Berten D'Hollander, and many others.

On Sunday, October 6, we will receive the Neighbors in Need offering. This offering supports the UCC's ministries of justice and compassion throughout the United States. Twothirds of the offering is used by the UCC's Love of Church Unit to fund a wide array of local and national initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct services projects. Through the national Love of Church Unit, https://tinyurl.com/2bfytatb, you can find resources, news updates, and action alerts on a broad spectrum of justice issues. Working with members of the UCC Justice and Peace Action Network (a network of thousands of UCC justice and peace advocates), the Love of Church Unit continues its strong policy advocacy work on issues such as the federal budget, voting rights, immigration, health care, hate crimes, civil liberties, and environmental justice. Neighbors in Need also supports our Native American neighbors in the UCC. Onethird of the offering supports the UCC's Council for American Indian Ministries (CAIM). Historically, the UCC established churches and worked with Lakota, Dakota, Nakota, Mandan, Hidatsa, Arickara, and Hocak in ND and SD, WI, and northern NE. Today there are 20 UCC congregations on reservations and one urban, multi-tribal UCC congregation in Minneapolis, MN. These churches and their pastors are supported by CAIM. CAIM is also an invaluable resource for more than 1,000 individuals from dozens of other tribes and nations who are members of other UCC congregations in the U.S.

On Mondays, October 7, and 28 at 1:00, Pastor Beth will continue to facilitate a discussion on the Gospel of Mark. Come and join us!
