Dear St. James family,

It's December so you know what that means – the holiday season is upon us! In the church, it also means it is the season of Advent, which is the beginning of the church year. I always thought it was interesting that the church calendar and the secular calendar started a month apart. For me, December and Advent are a great time to prepare for the new year. Prepare for what? More on that in a minute.

First let's talk about Advent. In my first year with you, I struggled with the idea of what Advent is all about, so I decided I needed a clearer idea. I knew it was a time of waiting. But waiting for what? To get some answers, I turned to...Facebook. I asked my pastor friends what they thought we were waiting for. Some said, "Baby Jesus." That didn't really do it for me. I mean, Jesus has been born, lived, died and was resurrected, so why are we waiting for him to be "born again"? But someone did post something that I thought rang more true – we're waiting for rebirth.

Aaaahhhh...now this is more like it. As we prepare for the new year, we are preparing for our own rebirth. Some might call it writing spiritual New Year's Resolutions. For me, Advent and preparing for Christmas are about looking back over this year and thinking about the spiritual practices I have. What works and what doesn't? Are there new practices I might want to try?

Now, in between all of the hullabaloo of holiday events - end of the year work deadlines, family events, parties, shopping, decorating, baking, hosting, etc., we might be thinking, "When will I have time to reflect on anything?? I already have so many things to prepare for!" And yet, this is a great time to make the time – even just a few minutes a day – to talk to God and then to breathe in the Spirit, and then act on what we hear. I find that when something is really important to us, we will make the time. When we make the time to breathe and reflect, that will keep us calmer and less anxious, more able to take on the events of the day with confidence. When we make the time to put God first, (not to neglect the rest of our lives, but to talk to God first when making decisions), we will find ourselves making better decisions and feeling braver, more peaceful, and more prepared for whatever December has to throw at us. Prayer and Suffering by Henri Nouwen taken from "Prayer Embraces the World"

"Come to me," Jesus says, "all you who are weary and find life burdensome, and I will refresh you. Take my yoke upon your shoulders and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble of heart. Your soul will find rest, for my yoke is easy, and my burden is light" (Matt. 11:29-30).

Here the deeper meaning of prayer becomes manifest. To pray is to unite ourselves with Jesus and lift up the whole world through him to God in a cry for forgiveness, reconciliation, healing, and mercy. To pray, therefore, is to connect whatever human struggle or pain we encounter —whether starvation, torture, displacement of peoples, or any form of physical and mental anguish —with the gentle and humble heart of Jesus.

Prayer is leading every sorrow to the source of all healings; it is letting the warmth of Jesus' love melt the cold anger of resentment; it is opening a space where joy replaces sadness, mercy supplants bitterness, love displaces fear, gentleness and care overcome hatred and indifference. But most of all, prayer is the way to become and remain part of Jesus' mission to draw all people to the intimacy of God's love.


