Dear St. James family,

Happy New Year! In January, one of the things we will talk about is Psalm 29. This Psalm mentions "the voice of the Lord" seven times. Seven is a number of wholeness and completeness in the Bible, along with three, twelve and forty. We will talk about how the voice of God is powerful. Many of us have been taught that God is all-powerful. I believe that is true, but I think some folks get all-powerful mixed up with all-controlling. Even biblical scholars, in my opinion, are getting it wrong. To be powerful is to be able to have the potential to influence, but to control is to direct or manipulate something or someone to your will. God is very powerful, but does not control. If God did control everything, in a way, wouldn't everything be better? No more climate change to worry about, no wars, no shootings, no illnesses, no car accidents. So to me, God created but does not control. We have been given the gift of free will. God loves us so much that God would prefer that we choose to love the Divine out of our own free will, and not because of Divine manipulation. God doesn't work that way.

And because God doesn't work that way, this means we have the opportunity to choose to be closer to God. We can choose to pray and listen and act on what we hear, or not. We can choose to come to worship. We can choose to help those in need. We can choose to be in relationship with God and with each other. When we choose God, we are choosing challenge, joy, peace, comfort, love, grace, hope, courage, wisdom and so much more. When we choose God, we are choosing to work with God to work for justice for the marginalized. When we choose God, we are choosing to make changes to our lives that will be for the better. When we choose God, we are choosing to love God and the world that God so loves. Let's choose to let God's power work in us in 2025!

### **Increasing Love**

I believe in this: I believe in God, whom I understand as Spirit, as Love, as the Source of all. I believe that He is in me and I in Him...I believe that man's true welfare lied in fulfilling God's will, and His will is that men should love one another and should consequently do to others as they wish others to do to them – of which it is said in the Gospels that in this is the law and the prophets.

I believe therefore that the meaning of the life of every man is to be found only in increasing the love that is in him; that this increase of love leads man, even in this life, to ever greater and greater blessedness. And after death gives him the more blessedness, and the more love he has, and helps more than anything else toward the establishment of the Kingdom of God on earth; that is, to the establishment of an order of life in which the discord, deception, and violence that now rule will be replaced by free accord, by truth, and by the brotherly love of one for another.

I believe that to obtain progress in love there is only one means: prayer...private prayer, like the sample given us by Jesus, consisting of the renewing and strengthening in our consciousness of the meaning of our life and of our complete dependence on the will of God.
