"Blessed are you who weep now, for you shall laugh."

"Woe to you who laugh now, for you shall mourn and weep."

Luke 6: 22, 25

Dear St. James family,

In early March we are going to talk about Luke's version of the Beatitudes. You know, "Blessed are the poor..." "Blessed are those who are hungry..."

Now when we think blessed, we think happy. Wait - the poor should be happy? The hungry should be happy?

I think what people often forget is to read the whole sentence. "Blessed are those who are poor, for theirs is the kingdom of God." "Blessed are those who are hungry, for they shall be filled."

And Luke, unlike Matthew, also adds some woes. "Woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation." Back in Jesus' time, and today, it was thought that if you were rich, it was because God favored you. And yet Jesus is saying in Luke, "Woe to the rich." But notice that the woes are the reverse of the blessings, like the two verses above. "Woe to you who are full now, for you shall be hungry." "Woe to you who laugh now, for you shall mourn and weep." When the rich become hungry, will they not be filled? When the rich weep, will they not laugh again? Will they not become the blessed? I see a cycle here.

Scholar Justo Gonzalez calls this a "'hard-hitting gospel' in that God's good news to the poor is also tough news for those who are not poor." Let us remember that the folks Jesus was talking to were probably all poor. The rich were few and far between, and probably felt very far away because they may not have had dealings with them, as many of us do not have dealings with the super rich. Also, maybe Jesus says "woe is the rich" for the chance of reaching them is slim, because they probably think they do not need God because they already have everything. Like some wealthy people now.

The good news is that blessings and woes come in cycles. We all experience them. We will not always be happy, but we won't always be sad either. When we put God first and our wealth second, whatever that may mean to us, the kingdom of God will be closer than ever.

Women's Fellowship wishes to thank all who gave women's toiletries to honor Women's Month, during February. They were given to Project Outreach in Royersford.


