Dear St. James family,

In early April, we're going to talk about how Mary of Bethany loves Jesus with extravagance. She did not concern herself with what other people thought, or about the cost. What about us? Do we love Jesus with extravagance? Extravagance can look crazy or wasteful. Do we do that? Or do we think to ourselves, "Well, I'll go this far with Jesus, but that's it." Are we up for loving Jesus without worrying about the cost (financial, timewise, emotional or otherwise)? Are we up for making changes? Jesus loves extravagantly. Can you imagine if Jesus said to God, "Well, I'll do miracles but I'm not dying on a cross." Or "I'll heal the blind guy but not the leper?" When we love Jesus with extravagance, we show that love every day, through our prayers, spiritual practices, the way we treat each other, the way we treat the marginalized, and the way we treat Jesus himself. We don't have to have a lot of money to love extravagantly – we just have to have a lot of love. When we pray, listen and act on what we hear, we learn to love others, and ourselves, with an extravagant love that we would never have thought possible. The kind that Jesus loves us with. Extravagant love that is unconditional. Unconditional love. Unconditional forgiveness. Unconditionally reckless and crazy. And it's for everyone. Everyone.

The good news is that Mary of Bethany loves Jesus extravagantly and he accepts her and loves her in return, even a woman who would have the nerve to anoint a man yet to die, to pour a ton of expensive perfume on his feet and wipe it up with her hair that she wasn't supposed to show as an act of thanksgiving for raising her brother from the dead, and as an act of extravagant love for him. Clearly, Mary of Bethany didn't care about cost or tradition when it came to Jesus. She cared about love. And she showed him her love in an unforgettable way. And she did it before he actually died. May we show our loved ones how we love them with such extravagance, whatever that may mean to us, and do it before it's too late. And may we love Jesus extravagantly, with our commitment, time, talents, money and everything we have.

invites you to an extraordinary season finale on April 26 & 27, 2025 (7:30PM), featuring "Mass in D" by John Knowles Paine (1839-1906).

As a founding figure of American classical music and the first U.S.-born composer to gain international recognition for large-scale orchestral works, Paine was a member of the influential "Boston Six," a group of composers who significantly shaped American concert music. Paine's Mass in D is a groundbreaking piece bridging 18th/19th century European musical traditions and America's emerging musical identity. Composed between 1859-1866, in his twenties and heralded in Europe as a triumph, this work firmly laid the foundation for future generations of American composers. Although widely popular during his lifetime, Paine's works dwindled into obscurity as twentieth- century modernism took hold. Don't miss this rare opportunity to experience the live rediscovery of America's first classical choral masterwork!
