pursuit of justice and the use of the word "All" as in, "All	are	" Use
your imagination on that one.		

I find all of these topics to be difficult to address in this newsletter. Grief, whether for a personal loss or a national one, is difficult. Wondering if people who need our help are acting in good faith is difficult. Pursuing justice like the Persistent Widow takes, well, persistence. And learning to stop putting whole groups of people in a box is also difficult.

Recently, I was going through something difficult and I found myself having a "Come to Jesus" moment with myself, remembering a number of situations that God got me through, not even by the skin of my teeth, but with flying colors. My ordination exam, my Comprehensive Vocational Review in seminary (the most stressful hour and a half of my life), the summer of 2019 and all of 2020. After the summer of 2019, I finally understood what people meant when they said, "My faith got me through." Keeping in constant communication with God, listening and acting helped me to know I was not alone. God guided me to the people who could help me. It was very challenging and stressful, I cried a lot. So it wasn't that I just sailed through without feeling through the feelings. God helped me feel them through. (So did my therapist.)

Where is the good news in all of this? The good news is that God is with us in our grief, God is with us when we deal with people who do not act in good faith, that God is with us and can give us courage to stand up for justice like the Persistent Widow, and that God's love is for "ALL" people, regardless of what we have done, or said. When we talk to God and listen and act on what we hear, we will be able to deal with all of these difficulties and more. Jesus will show us the Way.

POTLUCK DINNER


On October 11 we will resume our potluck dinners at 5:00. There will be a sign-up sheet on the board.

From the Conference Minister:

"And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and neighbors, saying to them, 'Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep that was lost.' Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who need no repentance." Luke 15

Pharisees and scribes grumble about Jesus' reckless hospitality. Instead of getting defensive, he tells stories. A shepherd leaves ninety-nine sheep to go after one. A woman turns her whole house upside down to find a single lost coin. Both stories end the same way — with rejoicing.

I thought of those stories when I read the latest research about Millennials and the church. For years, the narrative has been about their absence: that they are the "lost generation" to religion, how they are spiritual but not religious, how Sunday mornings belong to brunch and yoga. But something is shifting. A growing number of data points shows a resurgence in church attendance among young adults. After years of searching outside, many are slipping back inside — not always to the churches of their childhoods, but to communities where the gospel feels like good news.

It makes me wonder if the joy of the shepherd and the woman was not only about recovering what was lost, but also about seeing with fresh eyes what had been taken for granted. The nine-ty-nine were never less loved, the other nine coins never less valuable. Churches don't last without the tried and true. But when the missing one(s) shows up, it reorients the whole household around joy. New church member classes can have that effect.

Maybe that is what we are being invited into now. To stop wringing our hands about church decline long enough to notice resurrection breaking in where we least expected it. To see in these Millennials not just the return of "the lost," but the reminder that God is still in the business of seeking and finding, of stirring hunger and calling people home. And for us to join God in that by making sure our worship services, bible studies, community outreach and all other forms of "church" are ready to receive the searching. My deep joy is that several of our UCC churches already are. My deep sadness is that too many are not.

When I listen closely I can almost hear the sounds Jesus describes — laughter echoing through heaven, neighbors called in from the street, angels breaking into song — because one sheep has been found, one coin recovered, one generation reminding us that God's story is never finished. Neither, thankfully, is mine. And neither is yours. That is great news to share.
