The Lord is at hand; ⁶ do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. ⁷ And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Philippians 4: 5b-7

Dear St. James family,

The scripture from Philippians above says to not be anxious about anything. How's that working for you? How do we seek the peace of Christ this Advent? Stay tuned. For some context, biblical scholar Carla Works gives some helpful background here. She notes that Paul is in prison when he writes this letter to the Philippians, who are worried about him and about one of their own, Epaphroditus, who came to visit Paul in prison and almost lost his life for it. As you can imagine, the Philippians are anxious. There is so much that is unknown. The unknown. Boy, that's enough to make us anxious right there, isn't it? When we or a loved one are in the hospital and we don't know what's happening or how or when things will get better. When we have a family member or friend suffering from substance abuse disorder. When we are out of a job and don't know how we're going to make ends meet. The unknown is scary. Paul and the Philippians were also in a state of the unknown. How was this going to go down? Was Paul going to die in prison? How would the Philippians carry on? What about Epaphroditus?

What happens to us when we get anxious? I don't know about you, but I have a bad tendency to ruminate. Sometimes when I'm anxious or worried, the worries go round and round in my head and I sometimes have trouble getting rid of them. How do we stop ruminating and find peace? Paul talks about certain things we can think about instead. Like what is true, honorable, just, pure, lovely, commendable, excellent or worthy of praise. How does thinking about those things help us to gain peace? When we put all of these qualities together, what do we have? God. God has all of those qualities - true, honorable, just, pure, lovely, commendable, excellent and worthy of praise.

So I'd say being able to talk to God is a good start. It's a good way to get our peace, and keep it. When we talk to God every day, listen for what God has to say, and act on what we hear, we will be on the way to having the peace of Christ that we all want and need this Advent. This is the good news.

Each year, on the first Saturday of November, the Scouts place flyers and bags on mailboxes throughout their communities requesting food donations, and collect it a week later – just in time to fill cupboards for Thanksgiving!

Each year our sponsored Scout group - Troop 10 - embraces this challenge with passion. Our community stepped up with their donations as well. On November 15, in total, the Scouts collected 5,577 food items, weighing close to 5,200 lbs. This represents a 10% increase from last year! They also put in 240 hours of service for the event this year.




